Each plant is either native to, or has had some history of use in, the Fernandina/Amelia Island area and their use at Amelia Park is encouraged. The list is not intended to be restrictive to the extent that other species will not be allowed. The use of plant species other than those listed above and not included on the prohibited or conditional-use lists below must be approved by the Design Review Board and should be relegated to the more private areas of the side and rear yards of lots. The only prohibited plants are included in the list below.
